Jeff Baker Called meeting to order at 9:39 am

Marc Roberts moved to approve consent agenda John Cruse seconded motion passed

Sarah Delbecq presented the treasurer's report. It was filed subject to audit

Partner Reports

Angie - IDEM - TMDL making progress, working on Big Raccoon. 319 decisions have been made. 16 applications, funding 13 of them. Angie highlighted Lake Monroe water fund 501C3 is setting up local revolving fund to repair/replace failed and failing septics and funding Agriculture BMP's.

Kris Vance - NRCS - Filling in for Jill Rinehart's old position. Position will likely be posted early 2023. First round EQIP Dec. 16. AG Conservation Easement Program, Wetland Reserve, just closed, but agland is December 17. No CSP deadline yet, but it is anticipated in mid-January. People's garden initiative I coming to Indiana - mostly a recognition program (Typically school, urban, small scale. Must benefit community). RCPP Announcement coming in January. National equity grant opportunity to be announced in January as well.

Lisa Holscher - CCSI - Report is was sent ahead. New Program manager positions have been posted, applications are coming in. Adding a second agronomist in collaboration with Purdue, position has not been posted yet. Strategic planning has been going on. In person meeting will be Tuesday the 29th. Hoosier Ag Today will continue to produce CCSI podcasts. Has been picked up by 1 good idea. The Root project - slides have been created with high quality imagery.

Joe Schmees - Urban Program-Warrick County overlap has ended their portion, so we are looking for a new South East director as the South East employee moved to a closer to home region in the Southwest. Judi Brown/Teddie Mower - Envirothon - Envirothon is a program for high school students. Teams of 5 study about Natural resources. Aquatic ecology, forestry, soils, wildlife, and a current issue are the areas where students test their knowledge. Envirothon used to be under the umbrella of the state association, and they are wondering about coming back under the umbrella rather than being an organization on their own. Teams can be made up of FFA, 4-H, homeschool or other groups. Teams listen to experts and then take a 100-question test. Top teams advance to the state. Major component is Natural Resource Concern Presentation. Canada and China also compete at national event. National prizes for top teams often include scholarships. Created in 1979 as environmental olympics Indiana started in 1991 in Wabash. There are 7 regional contests.

Stan Moore made a motion to include Envirothon under the NRP committee Jeff Baker Seconded, motion passed.

Indiana Envirothon will submit monthly financial statements to IASWCD. Board members are encouraged to help build the Envirothon program in their home areas.

IASWCD Business

Financial Update

Joe gave financial update. The auditor will help us to not need a uniform guidance audit this year. We will need to amend our return from last year which Jeff does not think will be a big deal. Next year with an added urban program employee, the more intensive audit will be needed again.

Executive Director Transition

Currently have no Resumes or cover letters turned in yet. Amy has been posting the position in multiple areas and is managing the postings. Stan made the motion, Roger seconded that we spend \$250 to post the position-motion passed. Amy along with executive committee, and Stan Moore will be on selection committee. Joe talked about the process; his last day will be the 30th. After this we may put together contract to have Joe train new hire. The contract will agree to pay Joe Schmees hourly, an amount similar to his current pay to help shore up and train the new executive director, until the board determines it unnecessary not to exceed 10 hours a week. John Kruse made the motion, Roger seconded, motion passed.
