Welcome the 2nd Session of the 123rd Indiana General Assembly!

The 2024 "short" session of the Indiana General Assembly Biennium Session convened on Monday, January 8th and is off to a very busy start. Committee hearings were held that same day and bill filing lists are being handed down daily. With the bill filing deadlines, Legislative Services Agency (LSA) will be working overtime to get all proposed bills drafted and published. Bills are already moving to the floors and leaders

have made their goals clear this week with releases of priorities. Being an election year certainly will be a driver as well!

As mentioned, Committee work has started. You can watch online. You can find links below to follow schedules.

2024 Session Deadlines

- -1/9 last day to file Senate Bills
- -1/11 last day to file House Bills
- -1/16 last day for Senate Bills to be assigned to Committees << TODAY
- -2/5 last day for 3rd readings of House Bills
- -2/6 last day for 3rd readings of Senate Bills
- -3/4 last day for 3rd readings of Senate Bills in House
- -3/5 last day for 3rd readings of House Bills in Senate
- -3/14 last day for adjournment of both houses
